Keene, NH – The New Hampshire Chapter of the American Institute of Architects (AIANH) and the New Hampshire Architecture Foundation (NHAF) have announced the recipients of their jointly sponsored scholarship programs for New Hampshire residents. Grants were given to Matthew Arsenault of Hampstead, NH, a third-year student at the Wentworth Institute of Technology; Stefan Burnett from Derry, NH, a graduate of Pinkerton Academy entering the Wentworth Institute of Technology this fall; and Shannon Sickler from Amherst, NH, who recently graduated with a bachelors of architecture from Norwich University, Norwich, VT, and is now entering their masters of architecture program.

The AIANH-NHAF Scholarships are granted to students who are currently enrolled or accepted to an accredited undergraduate or graduate professional architecture degree program and who are residents of New Hampshire.
